The FCEE serves K-12 teachers throughout the state and our mission is to prepare Florida's young people for personal and financial success through educational programs in economics, the free enterprise system and personal financial literacy. We



offer the following resources: (All free of charge to Florida Educators):

- <u>Professional Development Workshops</u> The FCEE and our partner Centers for Economic Education train k-12 teachers in economics, entrepreneurship, personal finance and the free enterprise system. All training is correlated to Florida's Next Generation Sunshine State Standards
- <u>Financial Freedom</u> A student workbook (or CD) is designed to provide content for use within the classroom to improve students' financial literacy skills while meeting the Next Generation Sunshine Standards and reinforcing FCAT tested skills. It can be used as a text or supplement in a financial education class from middle-school to adult education classes.
- <u>Florida Stock Market Challenge</u> Established more than 20 years ago, the Florida Stock Market Challenge gives K-12 students the opportunity to participate in an online investment simulation and manage a hypothetical \$100,000 investment portfolio. Students throughout the state compete for the best portfolio performance and are awarded prizes at the end of both the Fall and Spring semesters.
- Governor's Awards for Excellence in Teaching Economics For 33 years now, the FCEE has recognized Florida's most outstanding teachers for their creativity in presenting lessons in economics, personal finance and entrepreneurship. Open to all K-12 teachers, the Governor's Awards for Excellence in Teaching Economics is a celebration of best practices and a way of acknowledging the innovation that teachers bring to the classroom.
- C.O.D.E. Business Ethics Program (Competition Of Decision-making with Ethics)

 We have worked with leading educators, ethicists, and business leaders to develop a unique interactive program that puts students on the front lines of a hypothetical business, where they have to make critical ethical and competitive business decisions. C.O.D.E. is a cross between Harvard Business School case studies, 'Jeopardy', and 'YouTube'. After field testing, the program will launch statewide in 2013.

The Florida Department of Education promotes financial literacy in state public schools.

Next Generation Sunshine State Standards. Financial objectives are integrated in lessons from early years through college. Examples of standards include: consideration of financial outcomes when making health-related decisions in a 6th grade health education class; a 7th grade economics class that discusses the importance of borrowing and lending; a middle school visual arts class that teaches how art careers financially impact their local communities; and a high school accounting class that introduces knowledge of accounting principles.

- <u>Career and Technical Education</u>. Courses and programs are conducted for state middle, high school, technical center, and college students that include instruction on specific financial literacy skills such as personal money management concepts, procedures and strategies. Some programs and courses concentrate on finance, personal finance, accounting, and global finance.





- The Florida Council on Economic Education (FCEE): For the past 3 years, State Farm has been a proud co-sponsor of the FCEE Stock Market Challenge Games that are provided free to all K-12 public and private schools in Florida. As part of our sponsorship, State Farm agents have served as guest speakers presenting our "Slice Of Life" Make it Possible financial workshop and Careers in the Insurance and Financial Service industry. In the 2011-2012 school year, 39,303 students and 901 teachers in Florida participated in the Florida Stock Market Challenge Games.

- TrueWealth classroom curriculum can be delivered to either grade 4, 5, or 6, and comes complete with materials and training for teachers.

- The program also provides parents with a simple structure for replacing inconsistent allowances and outdated piggy banks through our KIDS™ approach (Keep, Invest, Donate, Spend)
- The KIDS™ approach can be used for children (and adults) of all ages
- The program was first introduced with fourth grade students throughout Hillsborough County Public Schools in 2010
- In 2011 we added fifth grade students throughout Polk County Public Schools and taught over 7,400 students plus provided teacher training
- In April, we conducted a second teacher training workshop to prepare teachers for teaching over 3,000
 - students the concepts of TrueWealth beginning in late April through the end of the school year
